

### Strong Schools, Strong Community, Strong Tomorrows

The White Bear Lake Area School Board recently unanimously approved a 10-year Local Operating Levy Renewal question to be placed on the Nov. 7 ballot. This vote will be a renewal of the same question strongly supported by our community in the fall of 2011. Approximately 15% of the district's revenue comes from the local operating levy.

# Stewardship

- The district has a AA bond rating, which we have received from Standard and Poor's every year the district has applied since 2010.
- Our district received excellence in financial reporting awards from both the Association of School Business Officials and Government Finance Officers Association for 17 consecutive years.

# Increased student opportunities

- Our high school students can choose from 42 collegecredit courses. The total value of credits earned by WBLAHS students was more than \$1.9 million at University of Minnesota tuition rates last year.
- Career Pathways programs are available to our high school students in four areas: Manufacturing, Construction, Information Technology and Healthcare.
- Innovative programs provide individual advancement and support for students.
- District-wide world language, orchestra and gifted program offerings have expanded.
- The district's impressive graduation rate has continued to increase.

## **Partnership**

Innovative opportunities for students through:

- Program and facility community partnerships with YMCA, MacPhail Center for Music, White Bear Center for the Arts, Tamarack Nature Center, and others.
- Academic partnerships with local universities and international schools.

### Sustainable investment

This spring, our school board reviewed our current and anticipated needs for the local operating levy renewal and surveyed our school community:

- Community showed strong support for the White Bear Lake Area Schools and a belief that "the district could be trusted to properly manage additional local tax revenue."
- More than 80% of the community expressed support of the local operating levy renewal, which will not increase current taxes.

Looking forward

The district's student enrollment numbers are strong, with **continued growth projected** in next decade. The district will begin work on a new **Strategic Plan** in the fall of 2017, to be followed by a **Comprehensive Facilities Planning** process later in the year.
