B. DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. **Elementary Specialists Discussion of Scope and Timeline** - Assistant Superintendent Sara Paul, Elementary Teaching and Learning Coordinator Ann Malwitz, Elementary Principals, and Oneka teacher Julia Stonehouse provided a brief program description of Physical Education, Art, World Language, Media/Gifted & Talented specialist areas and highlighted our continuous improvement efforts for the 2018-19 school year.
