Tactic 1

We will reimagine teaching and learning within our building

Specific Result 1:

The ALC will pilot and then adjust and implement an offering of "Intensives." Intensives will be piloted quarters 1 and 3 giving students different, immersive experiential learning opportunities in order to earn credit and learn material that they are interested in. Examples: Audubon Center of the North Woods, PBL in specific subject areas and elective options

Tactic 2

We will partner with each student to develop their strengths, interests, and personalized goals for growth

Specific Result 1:

We will use, refine, and seek out new ways for students to identify their STRENGTHS and INTERESTS through tools, such as the Clifton StrengthsFinder, Naviance, MCIS, and Myers-Briggs Assessment.

Specific Result 2:

The ALC staff will enhance existing approaches to setting and tracking goals with students by implementing research-based programming.

Tactic 3

We will provide broad opportunities for students to explore post-graduation options

Specific Result 1:

The ALC will enhance options for students to explore postsecondary education opportunities. We shall accomplish this through increased college visits (focusing on two-year campuses), participating in College Knowledge Month, and creating a FAFSA Night to correlate with fall conferences.

Specific Result 2:

The ALC will enhance options for students to explore workforce opportunities by engaging in career fairs, partnering with others to bring career speakers to the ALC, and hosting resume writing workshops.

Specific Result 3:

The ALC will enhance opportunities for student to learn a trade by increasing our partnerships, organizing visits to training centers, supporting the information from and engaging more with the Career Pathways.

Specific Result 4:

The ALC will provide opportunities for students to explore military service options and will partner with veterans to provide "coaching" to students.

Tactic 4

We will provide a welcoming and safe environment that ensures the social and emotional growth of our students

Specific Result 1:

The ALC will increase opportunities for staff development, initially around the areas of Implicit Bias and Culturally Responsive Classrooms, but will develop future opportunities for learning based off student need.

Specific Result 2:

The ALC will form a committee that will collect information from students via surveys and input from staff members, then make suggestions for systemic improvements in order to make students feel connected.

Specific Result 3:

The ALC will create and implement a student mentor program.

Specific Result 4:

The ALC will take steps to decrease lunchroom anxiety by creating staff expectations for supervision, teaching coping skills and self-regulation, and looking into other possibilities.
