**B. PUBLIC FORUM**

Listed below are the procedures for addressing the School Board on a topic of interest or concern.

1. Speakers must reside in the District, be a guardian of a student(s) in the District, be a student in the District or be employed by the District. The School Board will give priority to individuals who wish to address a specific item that is on the agenda for that meeting. After this priority has been applied, any remaining openings to speak - up to the total of ten individuals - will be determined by lot.

2. Public Forum will be open for up to 30 minutes. (3 minutes per speaker, 10 minutes per topic, no more than 3 speakers per topic). Speakers are encouraged to avoid repeating comments that other speakers have made.
3. Those who wish to address the School Board must submit a written request to speak before 3:00 pm on the day of the School Board meeting. Requests must be submitted to the following email address: publiccomment@isd624.org, or by phone at 651-407-7563.
4. The School Board Chair will call speakers to the microphone and will recognize one speaker at a time. Speakers must be in person to be recognized. Only those individuals who have been recognized by the School Board Chair will be allowed to speak during the public comment period.
5. School District policy and data privacy laws preclude the School Board from publicly discussing personnel and student matters or data, including information, which, if discussed in a public meeting could violate law or policy.
6. Members of the public may not engage in conduct that materially and substantially disrupts any part of a School Board meeting, or that otherwise impedes the School Board's ability to conduct its business in an orderly and efficient fashion.
7. If a speaker violates any of the established procedures or engages in any prohibited conduct, the Board Chair will rule the speaker out of order.
8. An appropriate school district official may be assigned to contact the speaker with answers to their questions or with follow-up information.
9. A handout on the purpose of the Public Forum and the process is available at each regular School Board meeting.
10. Citizens may be asked to address the School Board on a particular subject during the discussion of that item.

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**BACKGROUND:**

Policy 705 states, “The investment officer shall prepare and submit to the School Board a quarterly investment report that summarizes recent market conditions, economic developments, and anticipated investment conditions.”

The School District works with two investment advisers, Brian Johnson with Public Financial Management (PFM) who manages the Minnesota School District Liquid Asset Fund Plus (MSDLAF+), a comprehensive cash management program developed as a collaboration of Minnesota Public Schools to pool funds to maximize investment earnings. Operating investments are primarily held and invested by MSDLAF+. Facilities referendum proceeds are managed by Ryan Miles with Ehlers, Inc.

Below you will find the information concerning our investments as of quarter-end. In the money market space, short-term yields still remain extremely low, as commercial paper and bank CDs offer very little value. Nonetheless, the total overall aggregate general operating funds follows the District’s investment policy statement and Minnesota state statutes (Minnesota Statutes 118A.04) as all the investment holdings are of very high quality. The District’s Other Post Employment Benefits (“OPEB”) Trust fund is also in compliance with Minnesota Statutes 356A.

As a reminder, the District can invest its operating general funds in only the most high-quality (low risk) securities as allowed by Minnesota state statutes and the District’s investment policy guidelines. This includes government securities (U.S. Treasuries and Federal Agencies such as Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac, asset and mortgage-backed federal investments, and instruments of other government-sponsored enterprises and instrumentalities); high-grade commercial paper, which is short-term, highly-rated corporate debt; certificates of deposit (collateralized and FDIC-insured); municipal bonds (state and local government securities); collateralized investment agreements; banker’s acceptances; repurchase agreements; and cash/money market funds. Since the permitted investments as allowed by state statute are of the highest

safety (and least risk), general operating fund investment earnings generated by governmental entities tend to be low relative to portfolios managed with more latitude.

For the period ending September 30, 2021, the District's overall general operating funds had the following characteristics:

The rising tide of coronavirus infections seems to have drowned out optimism about the economic recovery. Daily cases have risen to levels not seen since the beginning of the year, and vaccination rates have slowed at a time when relief from the federal government is subsiding. As summer has ended, a COVID-weary country may face a distressing reality check.

Consumers tightened their purse strings as the COVID-19 Delta variant concerns and renewed public health restrictions clouded financial prospects. In addition, supply-chain challenges, rising commodity costs, and materials and labor shortages are now weighing on business conditions.

At the annual Jackson Hole symposium on monetary policy, Federal Reserve Chairman Jerome Powell said that the tapering of asset purchases could begin this year as the U.S. economy recovers from the pandemic, but the central bank will not be in a hurry to raise interest rates. He also reiterated the Fed's belief that the current spike in inflation is likely to be transitory.

Longer yields are higher in wake of the last FOMC meeting. After September's FOMC meeting where the market received a relatively hawkish signal, the market saw yields surge in response. The rise in rates has been driven by the sooner-than-expected Fed timeline for asset purchase tapering and the "dot plot" revealing a potential rate hike next year. Since then, the belly of the curve has been relatively unchanged. Recent economic data has indicated that the economic expansion has maintained some momentum in the face of familiar headwinds but was ultimately overshadowed by a few busy weeks on Capitol Hill.

The U.S. Treasury has continued to use new bonds to fund the deficit, but monthly volume has been steady throughout the year. Reductions are likely later this year as federal fiscal stimulus costs wane. Issuance may also be disrupted by the expiration of the debt limit suspension, which will prevent increased issuance until the limit is extended, and then likely result in a flood to make up for lost capacity.

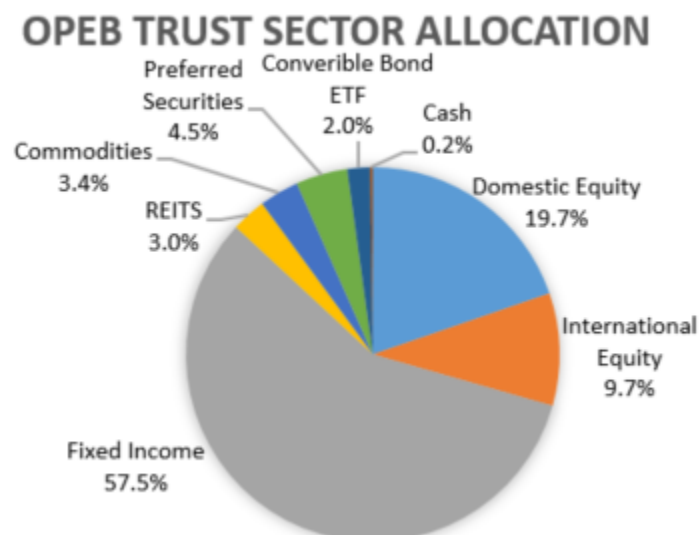
Indicative of the large amounts of cash in the short-term markets, usage of the Fed's Reverse Repo Facility has remained above \$1 trillion per day. In fact, it may become necessary for the Fed to raise its per-counterparty limit to add capacity and keep overnight rates above true zero.

Congress managed to avoid a government shutdown by passing a last-minute bill right before its midnight deadline. President Biden signed into law a short-term appropriations bill that will keep the government running through at least December 3rd. The focus now shifts towards debates surrounding the bipartisan infrastructure bill and raising the debt ceiling before mid-October, which is the estimated timeline when the debt ceiling will be hit.

The economic outlook has gotten a bit cloudier as rising COVID-19 cases and increased public health restrictions may slow consumer spending and ultimately economic growth. Meanwhile, the Fed is on track to begin tapering in the next several months, but any rate increases are far off into the future.

For the first quarter of fiscal year 2022, actual earned income in the MSDLAF+ accounts amounted to \$1,258.50. In the money market space, short-term rates have remained low and short-term credit is relatively just as unattractive as their short-term government security counterparts. Due to this fact, the budget for interest income in FY 2022 is still projected to be around \$5,000.

The OPEB Trust account managed by the District at the end of the quarter totaled: \$38,912,316.88. As of September 30, 2021, the OPEB investment portfolio was diversified and allocated as follows:



U.S. equity markets marched to new record highs, despite growing risks to the outlook. Equities shrugged off concerns about rising coronavirus infections, supply-chain challenges, materials shortages, Fed tapering uncertainty, and a messy pullout from Afghanistan. Trends in corporate fundamentals are encouraging, but overall valuations remain very rich. Developed market equities continued to lag U.S. equity indices. The U.S. dollar index has appreciated, and the movement of the U.S. dollar against a basket of currencies has rebounded from near multi-year lows since May, putting a drag on non-U.S. economies that export goods and services to the U.S. Currently, global economic conditions are characterized by: (i) cloudy economic outlook as COVID infections resurge; (ii) slowing consumer activity and payroll growth; and (iii) persistent supply chain challenges and materials shortages.

The following page summarizes our 2020A facilities referendum and 2021A facilities maintenance bond proceeds, which are managed by Ehlers Investments. We had the opportunity to take advantage of the high-yield, long-term municipal bonds that were available throughout the past year and continue to find high quality investments to meet the project timelines. We worked with Kraus Anderson to ensure that we will continue to meet our projected cash flow needs while locking in long-term investments as much as possible. The investments purchased are of high credit quality with an average investment rating of AA by S&P. The invested portfolio is structured in a way for investments to mature on a regular basis to meet our payment obligations without needing to sell securities early. In addition the portfolio currently holds a \$1.8 million unrealized gains for additional flexibility and reinvestment options. The portfolio's current annualized yield is 2.82%. The total portfolio plus accrued interest at September 30, 2021 was valued at \$248,655,890, of which 96% is invested in fixed income securities, while the remaining 4% consists of money market funds and cash to provide additional liquidity. Our Net Income for the quarter ended September 30, 2021 totaled \$672,318.

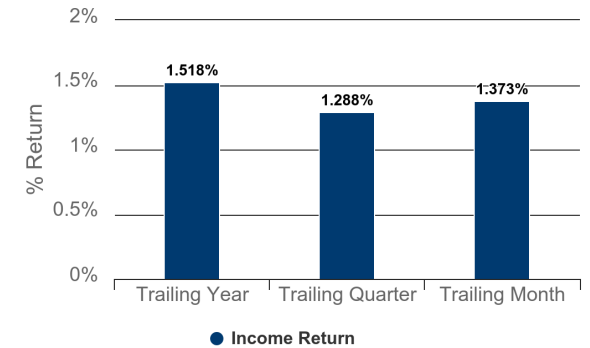

### Portfolio Composition

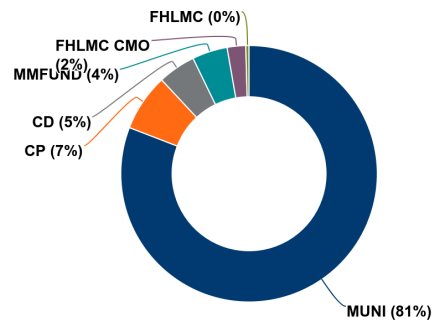
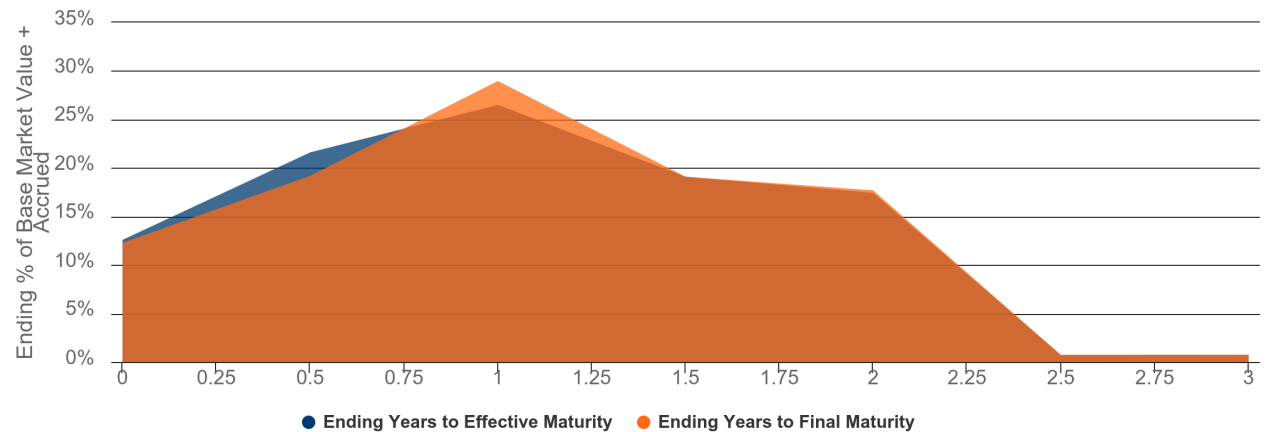

## **514 BULLYING PREVENTION POLICY**

### **I. PURPOSE**

A safe and civil environment is desired for students to learn and attain high academic standards and to promote healthy human relationships. Bullying, like other violent or disruptive behavior, is conduct that interferes with a student's ability to learn and/or a teacher's ability to educate students in a safe environment. The school district cannot monitor or eliminate all incidents of bullying between students, particularly when students are not under the direct supervision of school personnel. However, to the extent bullying behavior affects the educational environment of the school district and the rights and welfare of its students and is within the control of the school district in its normal operations, the school district intends to prevent bullying and to take action to investigate, respond to, remediate, and, when appropriate, issue discipline for acts of bullying which have not been successfully prevented. The purpose of this policy is to assist the school district in its goal of preventing and responding to acts of bullying, intimidation, violence, reprisal, retaliation and other similar disruptive and detrimental behavior.

### **II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY**

A. An act of bullying is expressly prohibited on school premises, on school district property, at school functions or activities, or on school transportation. This policy applies not only to students who directly engage in an act of bullying but may also to students who, by their indirect behavior, condone or support another student's act of bullying. This policy also applies to any student whose conduct at any time or in any place constitutes bullying behavior or other prohibited conduct that interferes with or obstructs the mission or operations of the school district or the safety or welfare of the student, or other students, or materially and/or substantially interferes with a student's educational opportunities or performance or ability to participate in school functions or activities or receive school benefits, services, or privileges. This policy also applies to an act of cyberbullying regardless of whether such act is committed on or off school district property and/or with or without the use of school district resources.

B. The White Bear Lake Area School District prohibits hate speech that has a nexus to any school activity. Any student who engages in hate speech that has a nexus to any school activity is subject to discipline, up to and including expulsion. Any District employee who engages in hate speech is subject to discipline, up to and including discharge.

- C.B.** No teacher, administrator, volunteer, ~~school personnel, student, visitor or contractor~~ or other employee of the school district shall permit, condone, or tolerate bullying.
- D.E.** Apparent ~~or perceived~~ permission or consent by a student being bullied does not lessen or negate the prohibitions contained in this policy.
- E.D.** Retaliation against a ~~bully or~~ victim, good faith reporter, or a witness of bullying is prohibited.
- F.E.** False accusations or reports of bullying against a student are prohibited.
- G.F.** A person who engages in an act of bullying, reprisal, retaliation or false reporting of bullying or permits, condones, or tolerates bullying shall be subject to discipline or other remedial responses for that act in accordance with the school district's policies and procedures, including the school district's discipline policy. The school district may take into account the following factors:

1. The developmental ages and maturity levels of the parties involved;
2. The levels of harm, surrounding circumstances, and nature ~~details~~ of the behavior;
3. Past incidences ~~and/or~~ past or continuing patterns of behavior;
4. The relationship between the parties involved; and
5. The context in which the alleged incidents occurred.

Consequences for students who commit prohibited acts of bullying may range from remedial responses or behavioral interventions up to and including suspension and/or expulsion. The school district shall employ research-based developmentally appropriate best practices that include preventative and remedial measures and effective discipline for deterring violations of this policy, apply throughout the school district, and foster student, parent/guardian and community participation.

Consequences for employees ~~school district personnel~~ who permit, condone, or tolerate bullying or engage in an act of reprisal, ~~retaliation or intentional~~ false reporting of bullying may result in disciplinary action up to and including termination or discharge.

Consequences for other individuals engaging in prohibited acts of bullying may include, but not be limited to, exclusion from school district property and events.

- H.G.** The school district will act to investigate all complaints of bullying reported to the school district and will discipline or take appropriate action against any student.

teacher, administrator, volunteer, contractor, or other employee of the school district ~~person~~ who is found to have violated this policy.

### III. DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this policy, the definitions included in this section apply.

- A. “Bullying” means intimidating, threatening, abusive, or harming conduct that is objectively offensive and:
1. an actual or perceived imbalance of power exists between the student engaging in the prohibited conduct and the target of the prohibited conduct, and the conduct is repeated or forms a pattern; or
  2. materially and substantially interferes with a student’s educational opportunities or performance or ability to participate in school functions or activities or receive school benefits, services, or privileges.

The term, “bullying,” specifically includes cyberbullying as defined in this policy.

- B. “Cyberbullying” means bullying using technology or other electronic communication, including, but not limited to, a transfer of a sign, signal, writing, image, sound, or data, including a post on a social network ~~Internet~~ website or forum, transmitted through a computer, cell phone, or other electronic device. The term applies to prohibited conduct which occurs on school premises, on school district property, at school functions or activities, on school transportation, or on school computers, networks, forums, and mailing lists, or off school premises to the extent that it substantially and materially disrupts student learning or the school environment.

- C. “Hate speech” means speech that lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value and:

1. disparages or demeans a person or group based on protected class status;
2. targets a person or group based on protected class status; or
3. threatens or harasses a person or group based on protected class status.

- ~~D~~E. “Immediately” means as soon as reasonably possible.

- ~~E~~D. “Intimidating, threatening, abusive, or harming conduct” means, but is not limited to, conduct that does the following:

1. Causes physical harm to a student or a student’s property or causes a student to be in reasonable fear of harm to person or property;

2. Under Minnesota common law, violates a student's reasonable expectation of privacy, defames a student, or constitutes intentional infliction of emotional distress against a student; or
3. Is directed at any student or students, including those based on a person's actual or perceived race, ethnicity, color, creed, religion, national origin, immigration status, sex, marital status, familial status, socioeconomic status, physical appearance, sexual orientation, ~~including~~ gender identity and expression, academic status related to student performance, disability, or status with regard to public assistance, age, or any additional characteristic defined in the Minnesota Human Rights Act (MHRA). However, prohibited conduct need not be based on any particular characteristic defined in this paragraph or the MHRA.

**F.** "Nexus" means a direct connection. Speech has a nexus to a school activity if the speech occurs during the activity, on property that is owned or operated by the District in connection with the activity, or through any District property or resource, such as a school issued computer or a District operated computer network.

**GE.** "On school premises, on school district property, at school functions or activities, or on school transportation" means all school district buildings, school grounds, and school property or property immediately adjacent to school grounds, school bus stops, school buses, school vehicles, school contracted vehicles, or any other vehicles approved for school district purposes, the area of entrance or departure from school grounds, premises, or events, and all school-related functions, school-sponsored activities, events, or trips. School district property also may mean a student's walking route to or from school for purposes of attending school or school-related functions, activities, or events. While prohibiting bullying at these locations and events, the school district does not represent that it will provide supervision or assume liability at these locations and events.

**HF.** "Prohibited conduct" means bullying or cyberbullying as defined in this policy or retaliation or reprisal for asserting, alleging, reporting, or providing information about such conduct or knowingly making a false report about bullying.

**I.** "Protected class status" means race, color, creed, religion, disability, national origin, marital status, familial status, age, sex, gender, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

**JG.** "Remedial response" means a measure to stop and correct prohibited conduct, prevent prohibited conduct from recurring, and protect, support, and intervene on behalf of a student who is the target or victim of prohibited conduct.

~~**H.** "School District Personnel" means School Board members, school employees, agents, volunteers and contractors subject to the supervision and control of the School District.~~

K. “School activity” means any school sponsored event or activity, any school program, any school operation, or any school function, including, but not limited to, any instructional program or extracurricular activity. School activity also encompasses any District resource, such as a school website, which exists to support a school operation.

L. “Speech” means any form expression that is intended to convey a particular message and is likely to be understood by those who view it or hear it. Speech can take many forms. Examples include, but are not limited to: written, verbal, and electronic words, statements, or expressions; images and graphic representations; messages on clothing, jewelry, and buttons; and posts on social media platforms.

M. “Student” means a student enrolled in a public school or a charter school.

#### IV. REPORTING PROCEDURE

- A. Any person who believes he or she has been the target or victim of bullying or any person with knowledge or belief of conduct that may constitute bullying or prohibited conduct under this policy shall report the alleged acts immediately to an appropriate school district official designated by this policy ~~any school employee~~. It is the responsibility of that employee to document the concern and forward it to a school administrator. A person may report bullying anonymously. However, the school district may not rely solely on an anonymous report to determine discipline or other remedial responses.
- B. The school district encourages the reporting party or complainant to use the report form available from the principal or building supervisor of each building or available in the school district office ~~submit a written complaint to school administration~~, but oral reports shall be considered official complaints as well.
- C. The building principal, the principal’s designee, or the building supervisor (hereinafter the “building report taker”) ~~administrator, supervisor or designee~~ is the person responsible for receiving reports of bullying or other prohibited conduct at the building level. Any person may report bullying or other prohibited conduct ~~may also be reported~~ directly to the a school district human rights officer or ~~to~~ the superintendent. If the complaint involves the building report taker ~~administrator, supervisor or designee~~, the complaint may be made or filed directly with the superintendent or ~~designee, or to~~ the school district human rights officer by the reporting party or complainant. If the complaint involves the superintendent, the complaint may be made directly to the School Board Chair.

The building report taker ~~administrator, supervisor or designee~~ shall ensure that this policy and its procedures, practices, consequences, and sanctions are fairly and fully implemented and shall serve as the primary contact on policy and procedural matters. The building report taker ~~administrator, supervisor or~~

~~designee~~ shall provide information about available community resources to the target or victim of the bullying or other prohibited conduct, the perpetrator, and other affected individuals as appropriate.

- D. A teacher, school administrator, volunteer, contractor, or other school employee ~~School district personnel~~ shall be particularly alert to possible situations, circumstances, or events that might include bullying. Any such person who witnesses, observes, receives a report of, or has other knowledge or belief of conduct that may constitute bullying or other prohibited conduct shall make reasonable efforts to address and resolve the bullying or prohibited conduct and shall inform the building report taker ~~administrator, supervisor or designee~~ immediately. School district personnel who fail to inform the building report taker ~~administrator, supervisor or designee~~ of conduct that may constitute bullying or other prohibited conduct or who fail to make reasonable efforts to address and resolve the bullying or prohibited conduct in a timely manner (~~preferably within one (1) school day~~) may be subject to disciplinary action.
- E. Reports of bullying or other prohibited conduct are classified as private educational and/or personnel data and/or confidential investigative data and will not be disclosed except as permitted by law. The building report taker ~~administrator, supervisor or designee~~, in conjunction with the responsible authority, shall be responsible for keeping and regulating access to any report of bullying and the record of any resulting investigation.
- F. Submission of a good faith complaint or report of bullying or other prohibited conduct will not affect the complainant's or reporter's future employment, grades, work assignments, or educational or work environment.
- G. The school district will respect the privacy of the complainant(s), the individual(s) against whom the complaint is filed, and the witnesses as much as possible, consistent with the school district's obligation to investigate, take appropriate action, and comply with any legal disclosure obligations.

## V. SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTION

- A. Within three days of the receipt of a complaint or report of bullying or other prohibited conduct, the school district shall undertake or authorize an investigation by the building report taker ~~administrator, supervisor or designee~~ or a third party designated by the school district.
- B. The building report taker ~~administrator, supervisor or designee~~ or other appropriate school district officials may take immediate steps, at their discretion, to protect the target or victim of the bullying or other prohibited conduct, the complainant, the reporter, and students or others, ~~including the perpetrator~~, pending completion of an investigation of the bullying or other prohibited conduct, consistent with applicable law.

- C. The alleged perpetrator of the bullying or other prohibited conduct shall be allowed the opportunity to present a defense during the investigation or prior to the imposition of discipline or other remedial responses.
- D. Upon completion of an investigation that determines that bullying or other prohibited conduct has occurred, the school district will take appropriate action. Such action may include, but is not limited to, warning, suspension, exclusion, expulsion, transfer, remediation, termination, or discharge. Disciplinary consequences ~~School district action~~ will be sufficiently severe ~~taken to try to~~ deter violations and to appropriately discipline prohibited conduct. prevent future incidents of bullying. Remedial responses to the bullying or other prohibited conduct shall be tailored to the particular incident and nature of the conduct and shall take into account the factors specified in Section II.G. of this policy. School district action taken for violation of this policy will be consistent with the requirements of applicable collective bargaining agreements; applicable statutory authority, including the Minnesota Public Fair Dismissal Act; the student discipline policy (See MSBA/MASA Model Policy 506) and other applicable school district policies; and applicable regulations.
1. ~~For students such action may include, but is not limited to, a warning, education, counseling, remediation, loss of privileges, detention, exclusion, restorative measures, mediation, referral to outside agencies, (including, but not limited to, law enforcement), suspension, expulsion, or transfer. Remedial responses to the bullying or other prohibited conduct shall be tailored to the particular incident and nature of the conduct and shall take into account the factors specified in Section II. F. of this policy.~~
2. ~~For staff such action may include, but is not limited to a warning, education, restorative measures, mediation, suspension, exclusion, expulsion, or transfer. remediation, termination, or discharge. Action against staff will be also be consistent with the requirements of applicable collective bargaining agreements.~~
- E. The school district is not authorized to disclose to a victim private educational or personnel data regarding an alleged perpetrator who is a student or employee of the school district. ~~In most cases, s~~ School officials will notify the parent(s) or guardian(s) of students who are targets of bullying or other prohibited conduct and the parent(s) or guardian(s) of alleged perpetrators of bullying or other prohibited conduct who have been involved in a reported and confirmed bullying incident of the remedial or disciplinary action taken, to the extent permitted by law.
- F. In order to prevent or respond to bullying or other prohibited conduct committed by or directed against a child with a disability, the school district shall, when determined appropriate by the child's individualized education program (IEP) team or Section 504 team, allow the child's IEP or Section 504 plan to be drafted to address the skills and proficiencies the child needs as a result of the child's



disability to allow the child to respond to or not to engage in bullying or other prohibited conduct.

## VI. RETALIATION OR REPRISAL

The school district will discipline or take appropriate action against any student, teacher, administrator, volunteer, contractor, or other employee of the school district ~~personnel~~ who commits an act of reprisal or who retaliates against any person who asserts, alleges, or makes a good faith report of alleged bullying or prohibited conduct; who provides information about bullying or prohibited conduct; who testifies, assists, or participates in an investigation of alleged bullying or prohibited conduct; or against any person who testifies, assists, or participates in a proceeding or hearing relating to such bullying or prohibited conduct. Retaliation includes, but is not limited to, any form of intimidation, reprisal, harassment, or intentional disparate treatment. Disciplinary consequences ~~School district action~~ will be sufficiently severe ~~taken~~ to deter violations and to appropriately discipline the individual(s) who engaged in the prohibited conduct. ~~prevent future incidents of bullying. School district action taken for violation of this policy will be consistent with the requirements of applicable statutory authority, including the Minnesota Public Fair Dismissal Act, school district policies, and regulations.~~ Remedial responses to the bullying or other prohibited conduct shall be tailored to the particular incident and nature of the conduct and shall take into account the factors specified in Section II. GF. of this policy.

## VII. TRAINING AND EDUCATION

- A. The school district shall discuss this policy with school personnel and volunteers and provide appropriate training to school district personnel regarding this policy. The school district shall establish a training cycle for school personnel to occur during a period not to exceed every three school years. Newly employed school personnel must receive the training within the first year of their employment with the school district. The school district or a school administrator may accelerate the training cycle or provide additional training based on a particular need or circumstance. This policy shall be included in employee handbooks, training materials, and publications on school rules, procedures, and standards of conduct, which materials shall also be used to publicize this policy.
- B. The school district shall require ongoing professional development, consistent with Minn. Stat. § 122A.60, to build the skills of all school personnel who regularly interact with students to identify, prevent, and appropriately address bullying and other prohibited conduct. Such professional development includes, but is not limited to, the following:
  - 1. Developmentally appropriate strategies both to prevent and to immediately and effectively intervene to stop prohibited conduct;
  - 2. The complex dynamics affecting a perpetrator, target, and witnesses to prohibited conduct;



3. Research on prohibited conduct, including specific categories of students at risk for perpetrating or being the target or victim of bullying or other prohibited conduct in school;
  4. The incidence and nature of cyberbullying; and
  5. Internet safety and cyberbullying.
- C. The school district annually will provide education and information to students regarding bullying, including information regarding this school district policy prohibiting bullying, the harmful effects of bullying, and other applicable initiatives to prevent bullying and other prohibited conduct.
- D. The administration of the school district is directed to implement programs and other initiatives to prevent bullying, to respond to bullying in a manner that does not stigmatize the target or victim, and to make resources or referrals to resources available to targets or victims of bullying.
- E. The administration is encouraged to provide developmentally appropriate instruction and is directed to review programmatic instruction to determine if adjustments are necessary to help students identify and prevent or reduce bullying and other prohibited conduct, to value diversity in school and society, to develop and improve students' knowledge and skills for solving problems, managing conflict, engaging in civil discourse, and recognizing, responding to, and reporting bullying or other prohibited conduct, and to make effective prevention and intervention programs available to students.

The administration must establish strategies for creating a positive school climate and use evidence-based social-emotional learning to prevent and reduce discrimination and other improper conduct.

The administration is encouraged, to the extent practicable, to take such actions as it may deem appropriate to accomplish the following:

1. Engage all students in creating a safe and supportive school environment;
2. Partner with parents and other community members to develop and implement prevention and intervention programs;
3. Engage all students and adults in integrating education, intervention, and other remedial responses into the school environment;
4. Train student bystanders to intervene in and report incidents of bullying and other prohibited conduct to the schools' primary contact person;
5. Teach students to advocate for themselves and others;

6. Prevent inappropriate referrals to special education of students who may engage in bullying or other prohibited conduct; and
  7. Foster student collaborations that, in turn, foster a safe and supportive school climate.
- F. The school district may implement violence prevention and character development education programs to prevent or reduce policy violations. Such programs will provide developmentally appropriate programmatic instruction to help students identify, prevent and reduce prohibited conduct; value diversity in school and society; develop and improve students' knowledge and skills for solving problems, managing conflict, engaging in civil discourse, and recognizing, responding to and reporting prohibited conduct. ~~may offer instruction on character education including, but not limited to, character qualities such as attentiveness, truthfulness, respect for authority, diligence, gratefulness, self-discipline, patience, forgiveness, respect for others, peacemaking, and resourcefulness.~~
- G. The school district shall inform affected students and their parents of rights they may have under state and federal data practices laws to obtain access to data related to an incident and their right to contest the accuracy or completeness of the data. The school district may accomplish this requirement by inclusion of all or applicable parts of its protection and privacy of pupil records policy (See School District Policy 515) in the student handbook.

## VIII. NOTICE

- A. The school district will give annual notice of this policy to students, parents or guardians, and staff, and this policy shall appear in the student handbook ~~and on the school district website.~~
- B. This policy or a summary thereof must be conspicuously posted in the administrative offices of the school district and the office of each school.
- C. This policy must be given to each school employee and independent contractor who regularly interacts with students at the time of initial employment with the school district.
- D. Notice of the rights and responsibilities of students and their parents under this policy must be included in the student discipline policy (See MSBA/MASA Model Policy 506) distributed to parents at the beginning of each school year.
- E. This policy shall be available to all parents and other school community members in an electronic format in the language appearing on the school district's or a school's website.

- F. The school district shall provide an electronic copy of its most recently amended policy to the Commissioner of Education.

## **IX. POLICY REVIEW**

To the extent practicable, the School Board shall, on a cycle consistent with other school district policies, review and revise this policy. The policy shall be made consistent with Minn. Stat. § 121A.031 and other applicable law. Revisions shall be made in consultation with students, parents, and community organizations.

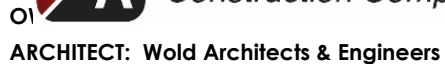
