BACKGROUND:

In the summer and fall of 2022, a group of approximately 30 community members and school district representatives gathered to examine the District's Strategic Plan. The planning team affirmed the Strategic Plans' beliefs, objectives, mission, and parameters. The group also considered the concept of strategic emergence as it developed four strategies that will be the District's focus moving forward.

- 1. We will create and sustain a safe, equitable and nurturing environment.
- 2. We will promote, encourage and support students' personal learning experiences and aspirations.
- 3. We will ensure our organization continuously transforms to fulfill our mission.
- 4. We will establish healthy and vital engagement with our entire community.

FINANCE CHALLENGES FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION

INFLATION

- Purchasing materials
- Utilities
- Fuel for transportation
- Contracted services

HIRING CHALLENGES

- More spent on reserve teachers
- Less applicants for hourly positions, thus...
- Increased compensation beyond budgeted

ENROLLMENT LOSS

- Leveling out after 3 yrs of declining enrollment
- Number of students qualifying for Special Education rose 8.8%
- Hopeful long term

COVID RELIEF FUNDS TO EXPIRE

- Helped maintain class sizes and services past 3 yrs
- Supplanted some qualifying positions that will need to be returned to general fund

FY2023-24 & FY2024-25 PROJECTED BUDGET ASSUMPTIONS

- Budget assumptions based on Governor Walz's budget proposal:
 - Formula Increases:
 - FY2023-24 formula allowance increase of 4%
 - FY2024-25 formula allowance increase of 2%
 - Special education cross subsidy funded at 50% = approx \$3.8M
- → NOTE: Both houses of the legislature propose larger funding increases for schools

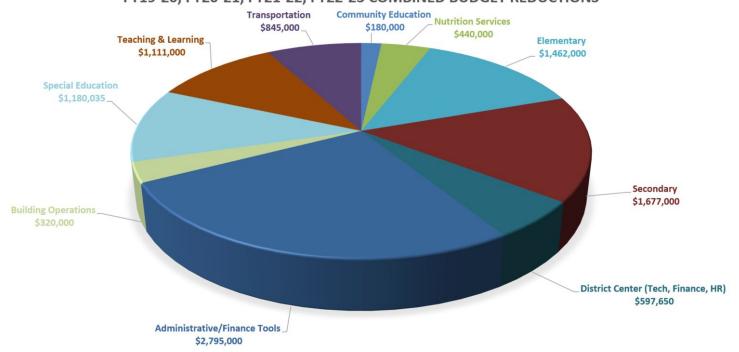

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Inflationary impact
 - Increased FY2022-23 total expenses by 2.25%
 - Primarily in the areas of transportation, utilities, and substitute compensation
- Special education enrollment increased 8.8% during FY2022-23
- K-12 Enrollment
 - Budgeted conservatively, based on most recent history
 - o Long-term enrollment outlook remains strong based on updated demographic study
- Legislative session
 - Significant investment in education likely this session, adjournment date May 22
 - Priorities:
 - Fully fund the special education cross subsidy
 - Increase the formula allowance, link to inflation
