






BACKGROUND:

The purpose of Achievement and Integration (A&I) is to pursue racial and economic integration, increase student achievement, create equitable educational opportunities, and reduce academic disparities based on students' diverse racial, ethnic, and economic backgrounds in Minnesota public schools. White Bear Lake Area Schools qualifies for Achievement and Integration funding to support efforts to close the achievement gap while simultaneously raising achievement for all students. Every three years, the School Board must formally develop and implement a long term A&I plan. As part of the process in developing the plan, WBLAS must collaborate with key stakeholders including members of the Systems Accountability and American Indian Parent Advisory Committees. Dr. Alison Gillespie, Assistant Superintendent for Teaching and Learning, and Mr. Brenton Shavers, Director of Educational Equity and Achievement, will discuss the process and progress of White Bear Lake Area Schools' FY 24-26 A&I plan.



• Goals:

- Increase racial and economic integration;
- Reduce achievement disparities;
- Increase access to effective and diverse teachers.
- New Plan: 2023-24, 2024-25, and 2025-26



Plan Development





Goals

- Three Types of Goals:
 - Achievement Disparity
 - Integration
 - Teacher Equity
- Goals must align with one of the following World's Best Workforce areas:
 - All children are ready for school.
 - All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed.
 - o All third-graders can read at grade level.
 - All students are ready for career and college.
 - All students graduate from high school.



WBLAS FY 24-26 A&I Goals (DRAFT)

- Goal #1: The graduation rate for White Bear Lake Area High School American Indian students will increase from 80% in 2019 to 96% by June, 2026.
 - Type of goal: Achievement Disparity
 - WBWF area: All students graduate from high school.
- Goal #2: The percentage of White Bear Lake Area Latinx and Black students who, by the end of their senior year, earn 12 college-level credits will increase from 18% in 2022 to 35% by June of 2026.
 - Type of goal: Integration
 - WBWF area: All students are ready for career and college.
- Goal #3: Details TBD

Willow Lane Elementary: FY 24-26 A&I Goals (DRAFT)

- Goal #1: The percentage of Willow Lane grade 3 students who are proficient on the MCA-III Reading Assessment will increase from 43.5% in 2022 to 68.1% in 2026.

 - WBWF area: All 3rd grade students can read at grade level.



North Star Trails and Wetland Bank



Background and Trail Study



- Connect existing trails through city-owned and school district properties
- Recreational and educational opportunities
- May 3, 2021 Council authorized a Trail Study
- December 12, 2021 Parks Commission reviewed concepts



Trail Concepts

- Educational nodes
- 1.6 mile paved trail
- 800' paved trail & 400' boardwalk in scenic areas (north)
- 350' paved trail & 1,000' boardwalk (south)



Wetland Deliniations



- Wetland delineations were complied
- City-owned property to the north, west, and south
- Existing private and public ditches
- RCWD ditch on west side
- Potential for wetland improvements

What is Wetland Banking?



- Increases the quantity, quality, and biological diversity of wetlands by restoring diminished or drained wetlands
- Market for replacement of wetlands due to unavoidable impacts



Wetland Banking

- Discussions started Spring 2022
- Monitoring/ Assessment completed Summer 2022
 - Potential for hydrological improvements
 - Potential for restoration of vegetation
- Process:
 - Design & permitting (up to 2 years)
 - Construction- wetland improvements and trails
 - Monitoring and maintenance (required for 5+ years)
 - Credits made available over time
