Update on School Board/Superintendent Goals 2.1 and 2.2

BACKGROUND:

At our last meeting the School Board approved School Board/Superintendent Goals for 2011-12, including those embedded into the strategic plan approved by the School Board in June.

It has been our practice that at each work-study session we will highlight certain goals, and provide regular updates on our progress on all grades. At this work-study session we will highlight our plans for 2.1 and 2.2.

Strategy II: We will create and implement a plan for global experiences and relationships to further understand world connections.

- II.1 All students will expand their global perspective through the study of world language and culture at the elementary schools.
- II.2 Secondary students will develop global understanding and competitiveness through expanded world language opportunities at the secondary level.

Ann Malwitz and Gretchen Harriman will be with us. We have asked Ann Malwitz to coordinate the committee which will be studying options for elementary world language, and Gretchen Harriman to coordinate the extension of opportunities for secondary world language.

White Bear Lake Area School District #624 School Board/Superintendent Goals 2011-2012

Goal I: Implement the Strategic Plan as approved by the School Board on June 13, 2011.

Strategy 1: We will develop a comprehensive understanding of our students' needs and interests to ensure students are challenged and excelling academically.

- I.1 All students will achieve grade level in reading, writing, and math by grade 4 and maintain grade level proficiency throughout their tenure in White Bear Lake Schools.
- I.2 All students will have an ongoing plan for post-secondary readiness that will be monitored from grades 6 through 12 and all students will have the academic skills to be successful in a post-secondary institution.

Strategy II: We will create and implement a plan for global experiences and relationships to further understand world connections.

- II.1 All students will expand their global perspective through the study of world language and culture at the elementary schools. (STIPULATION within each school, one or more options will be available to study world language and culture)
- II.2 Secondary students will develop global understanding and competitiveness through expanded world language opportunities at the secondary level.

Strategy III: We will ensure our facilities support our district's mission and objectives.

- III.4 The District will ensure that square footage to accommodate student population and program activities are equitable for all buildings.
- III.7 Each District facility will have appropriate acoustical levels for the site.
- III.9 District facilities will be designed to allow for informational technology to be accessible by all ISD 624 employees, learners and families.

Strategy IV: We will create a district-wide culture that inspires innovation, a passion for learning, and confidence to pursue dreams.

- IV.1. The WBLAS will identify strengths and weaknesses in the areas of innovation, confidence to pursue dreams, and passion for learning.
- IV.3. Faculty will have the skills to implement collaboration, critical thinking, creativity, and communication skills within their lesson plans.
- IV.5. Self-awareness and emotional intelligence curriculum will be incorporated within the curriculum review cycle.
- IV.10. A process will be established to facilitate the collection and implementation of innovative ideas.
- IV.12. The District will enhance communication, interaction, and collaboration through the use of a web site.
- IV.13. The District will establish a learning management system to support the development and management of online coursework to allow web-based learning for staff and students.
- IV.14. A policy will be developed and presented for board approval that leverages students' access to mobile technology and use of that technology in the classroom.

Strategy V: We will build a network of partnerships to provide personal and educational growth and service opportunities for students.

- V.1. The District will implement a process that will provide a consistent method to initiate and maintain community partnerships.
- V.2. A comprehensive needs assessment will be developed and administered at every WBL school in order to provide direction to future partnerships.
- V.3. The District will create a process which aligns a partner with a compelling need or promising vision.
- V.5. The District will communicate information related to partnerships using a variety of resources.

Strategy VI: We will foster connections with and among students and staff members to ensure all feel valued, supported and understood; and we will establish an environment that cultivates understanding and respect for differences among people.

- VI.1. The District will adopt a comprehensive bullying prevention, intervention, and support program for students and staff that promotes a safe, civil, and inclusive climate and is implemented in each building, program, and service.
- VI.2. The District will increase the number of faculty and staff from culturally diverse communities to more closely reflect the diversity of the student population.
- VI.5. The District will provide programming that will continue to create an environment of understanding similarities and differences among students, staff, administration, community members, and parents.
- VI.6. The District will review and assess the current plan related to cultural competency.

Goal 2: Ongoing Financial Stewardship and Budget Management

Goal: Considering the budgetary challenges resulting from decisions of the 2011 Legislative session, and a long period of little increase in state funding, continue to identify greater efficiencies in operations to help maintain financial stability and to continue improvements in program quality and student success.

Rationale: Over the past decade, the District has established an excellent record of financial management, as evidenced by ten consecutive years of recognition for excellence in financial reporting by both ASBO and GFOA, and also achieving an AA Bond Rating in 2008.

However, considering the financial challenges presented by the slowly recovering economy, the state's continuing budget challenges and the district's need to renew its operating levy this fall, it is important for the District to continue with strategies to meet these challenges to help maintain financial stability.

Evaluation: The District's ongoing financial stewardship on investments and budget management will be reviewed annually as part of the financial audit. The audit report is presented to the Finance Committee in the fall and to the School Board and public at the regular school board meeting in December.

Goal 3. Complete Next Stage of Communications and Marketing Plan for the District

Goals:

- a. Implement Phase II of the Communications and Marketing plan presented to the School Board in July, 2010.
- b. Develop a comprehensive communications plan for the referendum levy campaign in the fall of 2011.

Rationale: The implementation of successful outreach initiatives is especially important in the current environment, as area school districts compete for students. A net gain in open enrollment numbers would provide the District with financial benefits.

It is important for the District to understand perspectives of White Bear Lake area community members in order to remain a trusted steward of resources. Responsible stewardship is an important component in continued community support.

A long-range vision and plan about District communications ensures resources are appropriately utilized. Additionally, it is beneficial to have such a plan to allow for prioritization of communications and marketing projects and activities.

Evaluation: The communications and marketing plan will serve as a base against which current and future communications and marketing projects and ideas will be analyzed. The plan will be evaluated periodically to ensure it continues to be in alignment with the District's objectives. This objective builds on the successful communications initiatives during 2010-11.

One key evaluation piece will be whether or not a levy referendum passes in the fall of 2011.

Goal 4. Operational Improvements

- a. Building on the improvements made during 2010-11, prepare a program review of the District's food service program, including:
 - Redesign the elementary menu to include at least two entrée choices with one vegetarian choice each day with an acceptable gluten free option.
 - Implement the new USDA Nutritional Standards for all White Bear Lake menus.
 - Improve employee efficiency and productivity by providing resources for training, education, and networking with other school district nutrition programs.
 - Implement student lunch committees in buildings for the purpose of providing a format to gain input from stakeholders.
- b. Design and implement a comprehensive program for recognizing students, staff, and community.
- c. Complete the comprehensive program review of District gifted and talented programs (preK-12).
- d. Continue Phase II of the Technology Audit completed during January of 2010, building on the work done during the 2010-11 school year.

K-5 World Language Program Review (2011 – 2012)

A. Purpose:

The School Board and Superintendent have identified priorities for implementing the strategic plan during the 2011-12 school year. Strategy II of the plan states, "We will create and implement a plan for global experiences and relationships to further understand world connections." At the elementary level, all students will expand their global perspective through the study of world language and culture. The charge of this curriculum review committee is to conduct a study and review of exemplary elementary world language programs, examine world language curriculum standards and develop program recommendations to be shard with the School Board.

B. Specific Outcomes Expected:

- 1. Conduct an initial exploration of elementary world language resources, programs, standards and exemplary practices.
- 2. Outline components of the review process.
- 3. Develop a framework identifying beliefs, vision, and research-based exemplary practices.
- 4. Make recommendations for elementary world language program implementation for 2012-13 and beyond.

C. Strategies:

- 1. Consider best practice information, research, standards, and state guidelines.
- 2. Survey world language offerings in Metro area elementary programs.
- 3. Obtain feedback from parents, staff, administrators, students and other stakeholders.
- 4. Share results with Secondary World Language Review Committee.
